## SSi Micro and Rogers announce agreement to prevent roaming fees

SSi Mobile customers in Northern Canada can now travel elsewhere in the North or in the south without paying additional roaming fees when they use their phones.

SSi Micro, the parent company of SSi Mobile, announced an agreement with Rogers Communications Inc. on Monday that will allow their customers to use their plan's minutes and data while travelling within the country without being charged extra for roaming.
